- Grow in their relationship with Jesus and understand the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith - what we believe and why it matters.
- Feel empowered to live out the Catholic faith as they grow in virtue, discover their vocation, and serve others like Jesus.

Reporting to the Pastor, the DYM is committed and passionate about creating an engaging youth faith formation program to accompany our high school students through the conversion journey, and ultimately become disciples of Jesus Christ:

Relationship Building

The DYM creates an engaging, relationship-based youth ministry program that includes effective opportunities for the youth to have powerful encounters with the real, Living Person of Jesus Christ.



- Provide in-person, experiential encounters with Christ where they are not only welcome, known and loved, but they come to know and encounter the real, Living Person of Jesus Christ.
- Provide regular social opportunities year-round.
- Maintain an open door policy and connection with current students as well as program graduates.
 - Regular open office hours so students have a welcoming place to come and connect with others
 - On-going communication with students when they graduate so they stay engaged with their home parish at St. Margaret Mary

Youth Ministry Team

The DYM will form a Youth Ministry Team (YMT) of adult role models, who have demonstrated to be disciples of Christ, to help maintain a fruitful, mission-driven youth ministry program and to help teach and mentor the youth.

- Working with the Pastor, the DYM will form a YMT of parents, parishioners and community members who are faithful disciples of Christ and passionate about our youth.
- Supervise and meet with the YMT regularly to assure the youth ministry program is operating at standards of excellence and address any special circumstances with the youth.
- Assign each student to a YMT member to meet one-on-one and in small groups, assuring that all are known and supported.
- Form a cohort of teachers out of the YMT (formerly called catechists) to develop and maintain a faithful, joyful path in preparing for and receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- Establish the opportunity for parents to stay engaged with their high school children and their spiritual journey.
- Develop an ongoing and measurable evaluation system to determine the fruitfulness of youth ministry, and proactively respond to the data.

Catholic Teaching & Spiritual Formation

To help the youth continue to grow in Christ, the DYM provides both structured and creative opportunities to learn about the fundamental teachings of our Catholic faith - what we believe and why it matters - and to address their spiritual needs.

- Implement and oversee a consistent, year-round schedule of mostly in-person gatherings, using technology primarily for communication.
- Provide opportunities for the youth to ask questions and have engaging conversations with the DYM, Youth Ministry Team members, and special guests.
- Guide and help the youth understand our Catholic faith what we believe and why it matters.
- Establish a culture where the youth feel comfortable to talk about faith & life and real-world concerns
- Support the youth as they continue to grow in virtue and discover their vocation.
- Develop and integrate a faithful, joyful curriculum and path in preparing for and receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation for all youth.
- Coordinate retreats that allow the youth to gather, be inspired, and grow in faith as a community.

Service

As the youth continue to grow in their relationship with Christ, the DYM fosters opportunities for the youth to feel empowered to serve others as Jesus did and calls each of us to do.

- Provide regular service opportunities for the youth to serve at St. Margaret Mary and the local community, minimum monthly.
- Provide a yearly mission trip every summer for the youth to go out and be like Christ in the world
- Teach the youth how serving others is directly connected to being a disciple of Jesus.

All staff members are expected to adhere to our SMMP Core Values especially the DYM as the leading role model and mentor for the youth.

- Cultivate a culture of prayer within the Youth Ministry, praying for everything within the ministry and for the youth, modeling how to pray.

- Collaborate with other youth ministry leaders and share ideas & resources.
- Continually seek spiritual and professional opportunities to grow as a disciple of Christ and develop as a youth ministry leader.
- Attend Mass regularly, minimum weekly Sunday mass, to grow in Christ and be a joyfully Catholic role model.
- Continually model all SMMP Core Values to the youth while serving them and encouraging them to serve others.
